Petitions Collection of signatures in the form of petitions will also be carried out on the day. A document stating the demands of the protesters will be drawn up over the next few weeks to be presented to both industries and the relevant authorities for not monitoring the environment

safely.

The ESG and Bay Bucket Brigade say they will be coordinating the Gibraltar participation in this protest. They expect the meeting point to be confirmed this week and is likely to be in Campamento area.

The ESG says it will be organising transport from Gibraltar and urges everyone here to support this peaceful march for an environment where
